

Lost in Digital Space

I was watching a play at the NSB Little Theatre recently, when I noticed something odd about a couple of the younger actors. As they walked across the stage, some had a slight hump at the base of their neck and horrible posture.

The more I researched about the health issues connected to a cell phone or electrical devices such as a computer, I found that our screens are hurting us. It's called "text neck" and it's a real thing! Even small children playing with hand-held electronic games are at risk. It's the result of a forward-leaning posture usually associated with working/playing on computers and using hand-held devices.

For example, if you hold your cell at a 30-degree angle, your head could put a 40-pound pressure on your spine. At a 60-degree angle it's 60 pounds of neck and spine strain. You can keep your cell phone and other electronics at eye level to release head weight.

We are lost in a digital space and could all use some guidance. The negatives of a child, or adult, using their cell phones too often is too much to ignore.

Other side effects can include:

DIGITAL EYE STRAIN:

Prolonged use of handheld devices can lead to digital eye strain, also known as computer vision syndrome. The American Optometric Association reports that symptoms include dry eyes, headaches, blurred vision, and discomfort.

SLEEP DISRUPTION:

The blue light emitted by screens can

interfere with the body's production of melatonin, a hormone that regulates sleep. The National Sleep Foundation warns that excessive screen time, especially before bedtime, can lead to difficulty falling asleep and disrupted sleep patterns.

REDUCED ATTENTION SPAN:

A study published in the journal PLOS ONE found that excessive screen time, particularly in young children, is associated with reduced attention span and poorer cognitive development.

There's also increased illnesses due to germs. I read one in six cell phones has fecal matter on it. Gross!

What can we do to help our children and teens? Set some guidelines and house rules and stick to them. Children under 12 should spend no more than an hour a day and teens and adults no more than two. Explain why, so they are more apt to understand. Set an alarm to time the amount spent on their phones. If you must be on longer for work or a project, then pace yourself. Every 30 minutes, get up and stretch. Get some fresh air and exercise.

Give your family basic cell phone rules. They may fight you now, but they'll thank you later.

Iconic Photo Spots Around Daytona Beach

I'm old enough to remember when there were "Kodak Photo Spots" around theme parks to stop and take pictures with unique backgrounds related to the location. When you had to take multiple pictures because you never knew how they would turn out until you had the film processed later. While the technology has changed over the years, the idea of photo ops at special places with fun backgrounds has not!

My very first post on my public Instagram account, CassGoAroundDaytona, was with an angry Care Bear mural my family stumbled upon while touring Downtown Daytona in the months after we moved here. As I've previously mentioned, the Daytona Beach Area Convention and Visitors Bureau has a Mural Trail posted on their website to help you find amazing paintings at DaytonaBeach.com.

The Care Bear mural is a bit hidden, but when you're driving east on Orange Avenue in Downtown Daytona Beach and see the animal cracker box mural with mythical creatures pictured inside, you know you're close to the small alleyway that will lead you to him!

A new mural that is set to be finished in early September and has, therefore, not been added to the trail is being painted on the side of Midtown Café at 536 Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune Blvd. It depicts a child blowing bubbles filled with historic individuals from the area, like Dr. Bethune herself. It is such a sweet mix of respect for the past and hope for the future. I was at the Midtown Redevelopment Board meeting when the owners of the café and

For more interactive murals, there are wings you can take pictures with both in DeLand and Ormond Beach. Artist, Erica



artist expressed the dream that this mural will be the first of many (775 S. Yonge St.) since my youngest was still in a baby carrier!

If you prefer to take your picture with 3-D objects rather than murals, the two most iconic in Daytona Beach have to be the World's Most Famous Beach archway at the end of International Speedway Blvd. and at the Speedway itself.

The archway had been removed due to damage from the hurricanes last fall, but is back up and ready to greet you as you drive onto the sand of the beach. It can be tricky to take this picture as you must literally stand in the middle of the road! That's why I appreciate that the Daytona International Speedway has a selfie spot at one of its entrances to encourage drivers to pull over to take a safe picture of it there.

While Daytona Beach no longer has a selfie studio, there are still plenty of places around the city to have your Kodak Moment. You won't need to wait for your film to be printed to enjoy your pics, so get out there and say, "Cheese!"





VOLUSIA COUNTY'S SEA TURTLES SHATTER RECORDS WITH 1,482 NESTS THIS SEASON

In the last six weeks of the nesting season on Volusia County beaches, sea turtles have set a new record with 1,482 nests (and counting!) surpassing last year's 1,427. Volunteers and staff found over 33,000 hatched egg shells since June.

Loggerheads top the beach with 1,251 nests. Green sea turtles have outdone themselves with 231 nests, up from the old record of 98. Also, 5 leatherback nests and 4 Kemp's ridley nests were spotted. Hatchlings brave dangers like lights from beachfront properties, trash and holes left by beachgoers as they head to the ocean.

Bright beachfront lights might seem harmless, but they deter adult female sea turtles from nesting and disorients newborn hatchlings trying to find their way to the sea.



Beach residents can help ensure the safety of the nesting turtles and little hatchlings by shifting the lights away from the beach and turning them off during periods of inactivity. The moon's light is all these turtles need to navigate their way to the ocean.

Keep a safe distance when you spot a nesting adult sea turtle or hatchlings heading to the ocean. In case of immediate turtle danger, alert lifeguards, Beach Safety, or call the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission at 888-404-3922. At night, call the Volusia County Sheriff's Office at 386-248-1777, ext. 3.

WHEELS OFF THE SAND FOR FRONT-ELEVATED VEHICLES NOW IN EFFECT

Volusia County is ensuring beach safety by prohibiting front-elevated vehicles. County Council unanimously approved Sheriff Mike Chitwood's requested ban on August 15, effective immediately on August 21.

Implementing this change will result in an unobstructed perspective for drivers. Motor vehicles displaying alterations in suspension, frame or chassis that culminate in a front fender height alteration exceeding four inches in contrast to the rear will not be granted access. These fenders are like shields for the wheels to stop things like mud, water and other similar substances.


We arrived at the Great Wolf Lodge excited to get out of the car and inside the water park. That's right, they have an indoor water park with rides for every age including

Navigating Insurance Claims: Before & After a Storm

The timeliness of this article is impeccable. On August 22, I received a call from Sterling Scott, owner of Trust Public Adjusting Group, who is also a long-time advertiser of ours, about wanting to educate the community on hurricane claim laws, with the conversation specifically in relation to claims involved with Hurricane Ian from 2022.

He informed me that if you had damage to your property during lan then your timeframe to file an insurance claim ends on September 29, 2024. The amount of time to file a claim recently changed from 2 years to 1 year from the date of the event. So that means while your insurance premiums are going up, your timeline to use their services are being taken away? Am I hearing that right? Yup.

Even though you still have until 2024, he is expecting push back from the insurance companies to enforce the one year limit versus the 2 year time frame. He says, "The law changed from 2 years to 1 year after Hurricane Ian and Nicole and the new law cant be retroactive, so we should be ok for another year. However, it is very important

to get your home inspected by a Public Adjuster sooner rather than later due to the problem of late reporting."




He went on to say how many homeowners don't even know they have damage and have every right to file a claim for the insurance they pay to protect their home, until it's too late. Companies like the one Sterling owns represent you, the residential or commercial policyholder.

They offer free home inspections and policy reviews and they don't get paid unless you do. In fact they won't advise you to make a claim if they don't think they have a case.

This was clearly an opportunity knocking at my door. I scheduled a free inspection for my home and then interviewed him at the same time. Talk about a win-win for both of

He and his associate Dylan arrived, scanned my home inside and out with a Matterport, a 3D camera that uses virtual tour software, to quickly collect and record data. Dylan controlled it from an app on his phone and as they inspected the property notes were digitally made that corresponded to the scanned image of my home. I was impressed, to say the least.



The entire process was surprisingly simple and I quickly found out Sterling is like an Alexa for claim insurance questions. It's actually remarkable how much he knows. We completed our interview, after a rooftop photoshoot of course, and went about our week only to learn Tropical Storm Idalia was brewing.



As I write these words, feeder bands from what has now turned into Hurricane Idalia have started to roll in and the reality of the storm arriving, whether severe in our area or not, has set in across the state. Outside prep of loose items have been secured and all last minute errands have been completed... well, to the best of my ability.



Then I went to do what I always do, which is take a quick video of the inside and outside of my property. I honestly don't remember who told me to do that, however, it is a part of my pre-hurricane prep that I never forget to do. As I started to take my first video, I realized that literally one week prior to that moment I had a 3D scan of the inside and the outside of my home! Now I know I am as prepared as I can be.

When it comes to understanding insurance claims I have to say I feel way more informed than I was even three weeks ago. Do I know everything? Not even close. But I don't have to, Sterling does. Protect yourself and your home by understanding your policy and partnering with someone who will fight for you.

This issue will go to print a couple hours before Hurricane Idalia is expected to make the most impact in our area. I'm wishing all the best for everyone in this storm's path. As always, we hope for the best, but prepare for the worst, and if anything should happen, there's people like Sterling who have our backs.






From Pets to Protected

The C.A.R.E. Foundation | Apopka, Florida

Given our tropical landscape and mild winters, Florida is home to hundreds of animal and wildlife sanctuaries, with good reason. The C.A.R.E. Foundation in Apopka is one such place, but has a special focus on former pets that, quite frankly, had no business being pets.

C.A.R.E. was founded in 1996 by Christin Burford with a mission to create animal respect and education for neglected, unwanted or unmanageable creatures of all shapes and sizes, and to help them find their way to a new home. Whether surrendered by their previous owners after they have realized they're in over their heads or seized by authorities, all the animals that come to C.A.R.E. have a new lease on life. Part of Christin's mission is to educate the public on wildlife conservation and struggles facing these critters in the wild, as well as prevent further non-domestic animals from becoming pets when they shouldn't be.

She does that by offering tours of her sprawling facility in Apopka and traveling Florida to educate the public, which is how we first met when she visited the Port Orange Library. At C.A.R.E., over 200 animals of various species have found a loving home after finding themselves in a uniquely vulnerable position. Some have been so poorly neglected they are unable to be handled by anyone but Christin. Others are incredibly affectionate and love to greet guests. No matter the case, none of them are able to be released back into the wild.



We started our tour with an adorable, albeit noisy, mishmash of fun farm animals who uproariously greeted us as we came around the corner. The aptly named Barnyard Bunch consists of the likes of Pigourney Weaver, a cluster of chickens named The Spice Girls and a precious family of goats, plus so much more.

Hands down, Avery's absolute favorite to meet were the skunks. Skunks get a bad reputation, but I've never met a softer and more snuggly creature in my life!









And don't worry, as former pets they had their scent glands removed, so you won't be heading home with a new perfume.

She's also a sucker for any reptile she can lay eyes on, so a chance to hold a snake and gator was a big thrill! Scott is petrified of snakes so he took a few steps back while we got to know the scaly residents. The funniest part of our day was our interaction with the monkeys. Dolly, a tufted capuchin, was particularly playful and she had Avery in a fit of giggles as they traded funny faces and mimicked each other.

If you're lucky, you can spot some of the resident big cats. Despite their cuddly personas, we got to witness first-hand exactly why these species should never be kept domestically. We arrived at feeding time for one of the resident tigers, who just moments before had been a lovable fur ball. Once he started eating, however, the "wilds came out," as Christin and her staff like to put it, explaining that big cats

experience a physiological change once they start eating where they no longer recognize their handlers and are so focused on their meal that they can become very violent.

It was important to see all of the resident animals for their truly wild selves, as a somber reminder that the wild is where these animals really belong. Christin hopes that through her educational programs, more and more people will think twice before getting a wild "pet," and there will be far less to rescue in the future.



What stood out the most was that this was not just a place to keep these animals for the duration of their lives, but a loving sanctuary for them to truly thrive. As we walked the grounds with Christin, not only did we get a comprehensive education on the varying species, but we also got to know each of their names, their sometimes tragic history and insight on each of their incredible personalities. Each animal is part of the C.A.R.E. family and holds a special place in her heart.

A variety of tours are available to suit your group or family, with different levels of interaction. You can set up group field trips for your school or program, as well as have Christin come to you as part of her education tours.

King of the Jungle Tours include a guided tour at feeding time where you'll get hands-on with a few species, feed some new friends and witness a big cat feeding for yourself.

Caretaker for the Day Tours last 5 to 6 hours and allow you to really dive deep into all it takes to keep the C.A.R.E. Foundation going (for ages 16 and up only). If you're celebrating a birthday, be sure to let them know as they are now offering special birthday tours as well.

TASTE Bourbon Caramel Spice Cake



This Bourbon Caramel Spice Cake is full of fall flavors - covered with a caramel bourbon cream cheese buttercream and garnished with gingersnap cookies, it's perfect for any celebration.

Preparation: Prep Time: 1 hour • Cook Time: 35 minutes • Chilling Time: 3 hours • Servings: 12

Ingredients:

SPICE CAKE

- 2 ½ cups cake flour
- 1 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves
- ½ teaspoon cardamom
- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 2 cups light brown sugar, packed
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 3 eggs, large room temperature
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- ½ cup bourbon whiskey
- 1 cup buttermilk, room temperature
- Ginger snap cookies for garnish

BOURBON CARAMEL SAUCE

- 1 ½ cups granulated sugar
- ½ cup water
- ½ cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream, room temperature
- 2 tablespoons bourbon whiskey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ teaspoon kosher salt

CARAMEL CREAM CHEESE BUTTERCREAM

- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 16 ounces cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup Bourbon Caramel Sauce
- 1 ½ cups powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- · Pinch kosher salt







INSTRUCTIONS SPICE CAKE

Preheat the oven to 350°. Butter and flour two 8-by-2-inch round cake pans. In a large bowl, sift the flour together with the baking powder, spices and salt. In a stand mixer or with a hand mixer, beat the butter until creamy. Add the brown sugar and molasses and beat 4 minutes until light and fluffy, scraping down the bowl as needed. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Mix in the vanilla and bourbon. Beat in the flour mixture on low speed in 3 batches, alternating with the buttermilk, until the batter is just combined.

Divide the batter evenly between the prepared pans. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Let the cakes cool for 10 minutes. then turn each out onto a cooling rack and let cool completely. Wrap each cake in plastic and store at room temperature overnight to develop the spice flavors.

When ready to decorate, use a long serrated knife to cut each cake layer in half horizontally. Set on a work surface, cut side

Center 1 bottom cake layer on a cake board or plate. Spread 1/2 cup of the Caramel Cream Cheese Buttercream on top, then cover with another layer, cut side down. Repeat with the remaining cake layers and buttercream. Crumb ice the cake, then refrigerate for 15 minutes. Completely cover the cake with the remaining buttercream. Pour 1 cup of caramel sauce on top of the cake and use a spatula or knife to spread it to the edges, allowing it to drip down the sides. Decorate as desired with gingersnap cookies.

BOURBON CARAMEL SAUCE

Heat sugar and water in a medium saucepan over medium heat, stirring to moisten all of the sugar. Let the sugar simmer until it begins to melt into a golden-colored liquid, stirring occasionally. Once sugar is completely melted, immediately but carefully stir in the butter for 2-3 minutes until completely melted. The sauce will bubble rapidly. Slowly drizzle in the heavy cream, continuing to stir. The mixture will once again bubble and splatter. After the cream is mixed in, allow the caramel to boil for about 1 minute, then whisk until smooth.

Remove from heat and whisk in bourbon. vanilla and salt. Cool to room temperature, then chill for 15 minutes before using.

CARAMEL CREAM CHEESE BUTTERCREAM

In a mixing bowl, beat butter, cream cheese and caramel sauce until well blended. Mix in powdered sugar, vanilla and salt until fluffy.

Fishaholic: September Report

Hey, it's Captain Austin back again giving you the local report for the New Smyrna Beach area. It's September and that means snook season is open! In our part of Florida, the season opens from September 1 through December 15. If the mullet run is strong, expect the fishing to be good. Snook have a regulated fishing season mostly to protect their populations during sensitive periods like when they are spawning.

Here in Volusia County, snook gather in large numbers in and around Ponce Inlet in the months of June, July and August. During these times they can be susceptible to overfishing so they are protected.



Many people love catching snook because they are known to be elusive and challenging to locate and catch, making the pursuit more thrilling. Their behavior can change based on water temperature, tides and other environmental factors, making them a worthy adversary to even experienced fisherman.

One huge advantage of being on the water every day is that I can see the gradual changes from day to day. In the past couple of weeks some of my charter clients have

hooked some real monsters that could not be stopped and hung us up in structure. Some of these fish are 40 inches or bigger and as they say - they don't get big being stupid.

An added benefit of snook fishing is that often they are in the same place as big redfish and can be caught side by side. The redfish will start preparing for their spawn and starting soon there will be huge numbers of large fish in and around the inlet. The redfish will also be keving in on the large influx of mullet and other baitfish that get washed in and out of Ponce Inlet.

Let's hope we don't have any major storms hit us like last year. The fishing was great this time last year and then we got hammered by two hurricanes. Let's hope for the best! As always, let us know if you'd like us to take you out and put you on some big snook and

fishing Report

Amidst hurricane season and scorching weather, we find ourselves in the midst of some of the most remarkable fishing experiences I've encountered in years. The backwaters have transformed into a haven of bait and a multitude of ravenous fish. Schools of redfish are congregating, while the snook are unleashing their voracious appetites on anything that catches their eye!

With these low tides, the redfish have been masterfully navigating the banks, ceaselessly on the prowl for their next meal. I was even fortunate enough to witness a mesmerizing sight: a redfish emerging from the water onto a sandy bank to indulge in a fiddler crab feast. It was a scene right out of the backwater matrix! Countless exhilarating topwater hookups have graced my days, although not without a fair share of unfortunate break-offs.

Joining me in this angling adventure is my trusty pal, Dave McKinnon, who's been on an absolute tear lately. He triumphantly landed a massive, oversized redfish using a mud guppy lure. The mud guppy population is thriving, and it has firmly secured its place as my go-to live bait option. These little gems can be located in the shallows during low tide within the creeks.

As September arrives, the fishing action promises to remain as electrifying as ever. For an optimal setup, I recommend employing a topwater plug with 20-pound braid and a 30-pound leader. Additionally, I've had great success with a jig head paired with a Nasty Strike's bait paddletail, preferably in a vibrant white hue. And of course, I always keep a live bait rig on standby for the deeper holes and open water flats where the grander fish tend to lurk.




