

#### TASTE Curried Cauliflower Soup

**Preparation:** Prep Time: 15 minutes • Cook Time: 35 minutes • Servings: 4-6

This Curried Cauliflower Soup is a delicious and warming dish, perfect for cold winter days. The combination of spices and coconut milk creates a rich and flavorful soup that will surely become a favorite.

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 large cauliflower, cut into florets
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- •1 medium carrot, peeled & chopped
- •1 medium potato, peeled & diced
- 14 oz can coconut milk
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- 2 tablespoons curry powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- •1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1/2 teaspoon turmeric
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- Fresh micro greens









#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

In a large pot, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the chopped onion and garlic, sautéing until softened and fragrant. Add the curry powder, ground cumin, ground coriander, turmeric and cayenne pepper to the pot. Stir well to coat the onions and garlic in the spices, allowing them to toast for a minute or two.

Add the cauliflower florets, chopped carrot and diced potato to the pot. Stir the vegetables to combine with the spices. Pour in the coconut milk and vegetable broth, ensuring that the vegetables are fully immersed. Bring the mixture to a simmer and let it cook until the vegetables are tender, usually about 20-25 minutes.

Using an immersion blender, blend the soup until smooth and creamy. If you don't have an immersion blender, carefully transfer the soup in batches to a blender and blend until smooth. Remember to allow the soup to cool slightly before blending to avoid accidents.

Season the soup with salt and pepper to taste. Adjust the level of cayenne pepper if you prefer more or less heat. Ladle the hot soup into bowls. Garnish with fresh micro greens if desired. Serve the curried cauliflower soup hot, accompanied by crusty bread or naan for a complete and satisfying meal.

#### Garlic Naan Bread

This Garlic Naan Bread recipe provides the ideal accompaniment to the Curried Cauliflower Soup, adding a deliciously aromatic and fluffy bread that's perfect for dipping into the flavorful soup. Enjoy the delightful combination of these two dishes for a satisfying and warming meal.

**Preparation:** Prep Time: 1 hour 15 minutes • Cook Time: 10 minutes • Servings: 8

#### **Ingredients:**

- •2 cups all-purpose flour
- •1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- •3/4 cup plain yogurt
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons melted butter (for brushing)
- Fresh cilantro, chopped (for garnish, optional)







#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

In a large mixing bowl, combine the all-purpose flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Add the minced garlic to the dry ingredients. Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients and add the yogurt and olive oil. Mix the ingredients together until a soft dough forms.

Transfer the dough to a floured surface and knead for about 5 minutes until it becomes smooth and elastic. Place the dough in a lightly oiled bowl, cover it with a damp cloth, and let it rest for 1 hour to allow the yeast to work. After the dough has risen, divide it into small balls (about the size of a golf ball). On a floured surface, roll out each ball into a flat, oval shape.

Heat a skillet or griddle over medium-high heat. Place the rolled-out dough on the hot surface and cook for about 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown spots appear. While still hot, brush each naan with melted butter.

Sprinkle chopped cilantro on top for added flavor. Serve the garlic naan warm alongside the Curried Cauliflower Soup. The soft and aromatic naan will complement the flavors of the soup perfectly.






#### **Beyond Resolutions**

Exploring Florida's Wonders at Anastasia State Park

Our family doesn't set traditional New Year resolutions, but we do make it a goal each year to get outside and explore as much as possible. With that in mind, we headed to a beautiful Florida destination for the first time that's been sitting practically right under our noses in nearby St. Augustine.



We set out for an afternoon adventure and found a sprawling park boasting all the best Florida has to offer, with pristine white sand beaches, natural dunes as far as the eye can see, marshy riverside walkways and woodland areas ripe for exploring.

We first trekked to the beach, where you'll find four miles of seemingly endless blue water, white sand and dunes to take in. This is a no-drive beach, but cycling is welcome and encouraged as the packed sand offers up the perfect ride. With no heavy traffic, the shore is absolutely littered with

thousands of shells, and Avery's eyes lit up when she spotted them, sending her on a scavenger hunt of colors, shapes and sizes. Common shells found by beachcombers include clam, scallop, oyster and olive shells. There have also been plenty of reports of shark teeth, but be prepared to hunt as they can be tough to spot!

There are an abundance of wooden walkways stretching over the dunes that provide stunning overlooks of the sprawling landscape and the nearby St. Augustine Lighthouse. For those unable to traverse the beach, beach wheelchairs are available for free at the Island Beach Shop and Anastasia Water Sports with a Mobi-Mat over the soft sand that allows access to the firmer sand. Please note it is recommended to call ahead of time to ensure

The park is situated just outside of downtown St. Augustine, so a tasty lunch or dinner and shopping is never far away. You can even catch a concert right next door at the popular St. Augustine Amphitheatre, which is within walking distance and hosts a weekly farmers market

















Next, we headed along the river down the tidal marshes, where Avery hunted crabs and spotted countless birds. Given the variety of ecosystems within the park's borders, there is no lack of local wildlife to spot. In fact, the dunes are home to their own Anastasia Island beach mouse, an endangered species found only in this area. You can hike along the water's edge on The Marsh Trail, or paddle the river.



Kayaks, canoes, paddleboards, bicycles and even sailboats are available for rental on-site at Anastasia Watersports (seasonal hours). Like our own New Smyrna Beach, Anastasia is well known for its surf conditions as well.

We finished up our day with a hike along the Ancient Dunes Nature Trail, which loops through the shady maritime hammock and winds through the dunes. Avery spent her time hopping over tree roots and clambering up the ancient live oaks.


If you want to extend your visit (and trust me, you won't run out of nooks and crannies to explore!) there are 139 full hook-up campsites for campers, RVs and tents available, all of which are located within the maritime hammock, providing plenty of shade and a short walk to the beach and river. There's even a Bedtime Story Camper Lending Library on-site with age-appropriate children's books. With all this park has to offer, you may never want to leave!





# Fishaholic: January Report

This month is usually our coldest of the year and the cold fronts start marching down our way consistently almost every week. Fishing can be challenging especially when air temps are in the 30s and the wind is howling. If you are adaptable, fishing opportunities are plentiful.

Black drum become more available to anglers this time of year and everyone can get in on the action including shorebound anglers. Some of these fish are huge and can weigh over 30 pounds and can be a challenge to catch on light tackle. Smaller fish in the 5- to 10-pound range are encountered many times while fishing for sheepshead which are another fish that we target this time of the year. Sheepshead can be found anywhere there are underwater structures that have barnacles on it. In the creeks, sheepsheads are often found amongst the mangrove roots. Live shrimp are hard to beat as the bait of choice.

Snook and redfish are always around. Snook are cold sensitive and will become less active when the water temps drop below 60 degrees. Redfish are hardier and will be feeding when tides are pushing water in and out of the inlet and creeks. In the shallow waters like Mosquito Lagoon, anglers will find redfish on the flats adjacent to deeper water.

This time of the year, the water is clear and many times you can sight fish the redfish and sea trout. Both species can be caught using live bait or lures. The water conditions in Mosquito Lagoon have been fantastic with strong seagrass growth that hasn't been seen in years. 2023 will go down as the year we finally saw drastic improvements in water quality. Let's hope 2024 will continue the trend.

Winter has officially settled in, bringing with it a season of relentless rain and high tides that have yet to clear the waters. Despite the challenging conditions, the fish remain remarkably active, delivering solid bites for anglers eager to brave the elements. A recent fishing expedition with my childhood best friend, Chris Peterson, proved to be a stellar day, with over 20 catches in a backwater hole - redfish and snook putting on a show in a mere 30 minutes.

Personally, I've been finding success with the trusty Henn Lil' Shrimp soft baits, especially during a memorable sight-casting encounter with a redfish tucked beneath a mangrove in a secluded cove. While the bait hasn't quite formed schools yet, the approaching colder weather promises the arrival of masses of mullet. Keep an eye out for that distinctive cold patch, as the subsequent warmer days are sure to create prime conditions for productive fishing.

Living by the river offers a front-row seat to numerous memorable moments. Bill Gallagher, a local surfer and painter, recently transformed one of my photos capturing the release of a redfish into a stunning painting. His remarkable talents shine through, and the resulting artwork beautifully encapsulates the essence of the experience.

This month, anticipate ongoing tight lines and diminishing tide heights. The bait will soon gather in schools, and improved water clarity will facilitate easier sight fishing. As an added bonus, the arrival of large gator trout is on the horizon. Wishing everyone a happy New Year filled with joyous moments and successful angling adventures!
