

Florida's Vacation Rental Regulation

Gov. DeSantis Blocks Statewide Control

In June 2024, Gov. Ron DeSantis vetoed a major bill that would have changed how vacation rentals are regulated across Florida. The bill, which passed in the Florida Legislature earlier this year, aimed to take control of vacation rental regulations away from local governments and give it to the state, leading to heated debates about how vacation rentals should be managed.

Local officials from various counties and cities have said that regulating vacation rentals is a top concern among voters. Many local governments have spent years creating rules to address these rentals. The bill proposed that existing county regulations from before 2016 would stay in place, while city rules made after 2011 would be canceled.

In Volusia County, short-term rentals (bookings of less than 30 days) are not allowed in singlefamily residential areas. These rentals are treated as hotel or motel uses, which are only permitted in commercial zones. However, single-family homes in tourist commercial zones can offer short-term

rentals. According to a 2021 County Council meeting agenda, the current hotel/motel rules have been in place since 2004.

Several cities in Volusia County have also set their own rules for managing vacation rentals, including where these rentals can operate and the minimum stay length required.

If passed, the bill would have required the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) to create a database with information about all vacation rentals and assign a "unique identifier" to each property. Rental platforms like Airbnb would need to include this identifier and local registration numbers in their listings and collect and send in sales taxes for rentals.

Critics worried that giving each property a unique identifier and gathering detailed registration information could invade property owners' privacy and create security risks. There were also doubts about whether the state could

enforce these new rules effectively and ensure all rental platforms followed the regulations consistently.

Several groups, including vacation rental management companies and Florida Realtors (one of the largest trade groups in the state), pushed for the veto. FloridaRealtors.org stated that "the bill failed to strike a balance between the rights of private property owners to rent their properties on a short-term basis and the ability of local governments to regulate these rentals." Others argued that a state-wide policy would ignore the specific needs and challenges of different communities, where local rules often address unique issues.

Supporters of the bill believed it would curb what they saw as excessive local government control. The Florida Restaurant and Lodging Association, a key supporter, said in a previous news release that two parts of the bill were crucial to closing gaps between listed rentals and licensed ones. The bill would have required rental platforms to submit quarterly reports to the state, listing all units on their sites along with license numbers and locations. This level of detail would have helped the state better enforce regulations, track violations, and ensure that all rentals are properly licensed.

The bill also included measures like setting occupancy limits, allowing officials to suspend registrations for major violations, charging fees for inspections, and issuing temporary licenses during the application process. Altogether, the bill aimed to create a more organized and accountable system for managing vacation rentals in Florida.

Second Chances for Employment Volusia County

If you've been reading my posts here or following my Instagram for a while, you know that I try to keep things positive and fun. I promise to end on a positive note if you stick with me, but I must share two hard stories first.

In March, I was the victim of a crime where the accused is a repeat offender. I'm preparing for the case to go to trial as I write this, so the incident is fresh in my mind. Separately, our family lost one of our first friends from when we moved to Daytona Beach to cancer. We met him while he was mowing our neighbor's lawn and learned that he had previously been incarcerated, where inmates were used to perform yard work around the county. From his experience and not being hirable with his criminal record, he decided to start his own company and had been our friend and "lawn care guy" for the past six years.

These two men have led me to consider our use of jails or "correctional facilities" and what happens to people after they are released. Neither man was able to find a job after serving their time, a common hiring practice for many businesses, so what options did they have? One returned to crime, and one overcame the odds to start his own business. Can't we give more options than this?

The short answer is yes! Just this past August, the Port Orange South Daytona Chamber of Commerce partnered with the Volusia County Division of Corrections to host the "Second Chance Initiative Job Fair" to, according to the chamber's website, "Assist individuals who are currently incarcerated in overcoming the challenges of finding employment." They invited businesses to the jail that were willing to give a "second chance" to people after serving their time so they would have a job upon release.

Separately, I visited the Rise Yaupon Tea factory in Edgewater (504 Pullman Road) recently, which also hires "second chance" employees. Most of their yaupon trees are at a farm in Palatka and are then dried and sent to the factory for processing and mixing with different flavors for their unique blends. This woman- and familyowned business has inclusive hiring practices and opens its process to visitors to tour the factory and sample the teas in their café at the end.



Our Piece of Paradise

Central Florida's Hidden Gem: Oakland Nature Preserve

Oakland, FL

Florida is a place where nature still thrives, with wide-open spaces and wildlife that remind us of the state's wild roots. Beyond the theme parks and busy beaches, there's a side of Florida that's all about peaceful hikes, birdwatching, and the simple pleasure of being surrounded by nature. Just a short 30-minute drive from Orlando, Oakland Nature Preserve offers a refreshing escape from the crowds. This quiet spot is perfect for anyone looking to unwind and explore Florida's natural beauty at a



This preserve is unique in that it is not a state park, but is owned by the city of Oakland and relies heavily on the dedication of hardworking and passionate volunteers.

We made our first stop into the nature center/ museum before hitting the trails, where we found two wonderful locals that were eager to give us the lowdown on all this preserve has to offer, highlighting the must-sees for an afternoon visit, and showing Avery around the numerous hands-on educational activities perfect for all ages.

The center, a log-style cabin modeled after early pioneer settlements to the area, is also home to several native Florida species, both live and taxidermied animals on display, including several fish, reptiles, amphibians and insects. Avery and the staff took turns quizzing each other on their wildlife knowledge before we set off to hit some trails. Our first stop took us to the relocated fish camp cabin harking back to the roots of nearby Lake Apopka's 1880s-1900s fishing boom that made the area what it is today.

In 1997, Oakland Nature Preserve was first established and began fundraising and working to acquire the land and relocate the cabin. Today, the preserve encompasses 150 total acres, including 50 acres of uplands and 100 acres of forested wetlands. A beautifully maintained boardwalk leads from the center all the way to Lake Apopka, with a large pavilion on the lakefront with plenty of seating to relax and take in the view.

In addition to numerous winding trails, the preserve is known for its wildlife spotting.









We were lucky to get the chance to watch three alligator hatchlings as they sunbathed and swam lazily near the shore. No dogs are allowed in the preserve to ensure the safety of visitors and wildlife alike, so creatures are numerous in their natural habitats. We also spotted a number of



insects and other critters. The trails are lined with interpretive signs and details on the native flora and fauna surrounding the area.

Next up, we paid a visit to the Nature Play area, a project created by the West Orange Foundation and local Boy Scouts, where kids (my "big kid," Scott included) can create log and stump obstacle courses, get their hands dirty in the sand and sifting table, or build with sticks.

The preserve also hosts tons of great events that you can find listed on their website and Facebook page. Coming up this fall is a nighttime Jack-o-lantern hike, with the trail lined with community-carved pumpkins, creating a magical evening walk. Guests can dress in costume, and enjoy candy for the kids and a chance to see some cool critters. All proceeds benefit the preserve. Other weekly events include Story Time at the Preserve and Science Saturdays.

Oakland Nature Preserve is the ideal spot for any level of activity, from a relaxing stroll to a more strenuous upland hike. The preserve works hard to

protect the area's natural beauty and educate the next generation of conservationists, like my little critter lover Avery.

This general election, when we head to the polls, it's important to remember that the future of Florida and the preservation of the scenic landscapes and wildlife habitats we know and love are the responsibility of every Floridian. #ProtectOurParks





Ever been to a place where you can eat, drink, throw axes, and catch a game all in one spot? That's exactly what went down at Brandon's birthday bash at Iron Axe Bar & Grill in South Daytona.

We kicked things off with drinks and ordered some food while our server, who doubled as our axe-throwing coach, laid down the rules and gave us some much-needed tips. I opted for the hand-cut dry-aged ribeye and fried green tomatoes, expecting typical bar fare. I was pleasantly surprised - the steak was on point, and those fried green tomatoes made for a great start to the night. The Mrs. loved the mac and cheese and has been raving about it ever since.



Then it was time to get competitive. My wife and I both have competitive spirits and always enjoy a good challenge. We split into teams, and the game was on. Every bullseye got us roaring with cheers, while the misses were met with endless chuckles and smack talk from the other team

We had people there who were ready to go and some more timid than others, but by the end of the night, everyone participated, and we made it a night to remember. And dare I say, the girls actually ended up being better than the guys!

Each lane is rented by the hour. You can also easily reserve a spot online and add up to six people per lane. Games are projected onto the wood, giving you different targets during different games and lighting up when you hit a bullseye. Don't forget to wear closed toed shoes! That is a must if you want to participate.

For anyone new to axe throwing, here are a few tips that really helped me: First, your grip matters - hold the axe like you're shaking hands with it, firm but not too tight. For your stance, keep your feet shoulder-width apart and your weight slightly forward. If you're right-handed, step forward with your left foot as you throw and keep everything lined up with the target.

The key is in the release - start with the axe

high over your head, swing it down smoothly, and let go when it's parallel to the target. You want it to rotate just once before it sticks. And remember, consistency is crucial. It's not about power but getting that smooth throw every time. Don't forget the follow-through!



Iron Axe Bar and Grill isn't just about axe throwing. They've got cornhole, darts, and giant Jenga if you need a break from the throwing action. The vibe is chill but with plenty of energy. It's the kind of place where you can be competitive without taking things too seriously.

The staff kept everything running smoothly, making sure we were all having a blast and jumping in with tips when needed.

It was a great space to throw a party - no pun intended! You don't have to reserve a space if you pick a slower day and time of the week. We chose Monday at 6:30 p.m. We arrived a couple of minutes early and placed balloons and noisemakers out to "reserve" our spot.

If you're looking for a spot to relax, play some games, and enjoy great company, Iron Axe is definitely worth a visit. A big shoutout to Brandon and everyone who joined in - you made it a day to remember!



Slow Cooker Jambalaya

I've only been to Louisiana once, and I have so little knowledge of Cajun and Creole food, it's actually shameful.

Let's get this out of the way - we won't pretend that this is a beautiful dish. It's definitely not, at least not in the traditional sense. But once you get past the tomato-tinted hue of your bowl and dig in, you might just feel a bit Cajun

It all starts with a beautiful mirepoix. The holy trinity of Cajun cooking: onions, peppers and celery. I won't tell you what kind of onions you should use. We're partial to red ones, but if you're a sweet yellow fan, or all you have on hand is white, it won't really matter. I guess even shallots would work in a pinch, but that seems like such a waste.

I am the worst vegetable eater on the planet. I love them so much, but after my (excessive) grocery purchases are put away in the fridge, it's like they fall into a black hole. I swear, the contents of my crisper drawer go to another



dimension. Most of the time I don't see the sweet veggies again until they're just past their "are you sure you wanna eat that?" stage. There just aren't enough hours in the days I get to spend cooking to use everything up.

As far as peppers go, if you are stuck with only green ones, no worries. Your dinner may not be as colorful, but it will taste just as delish. I rarely have red or yellow ones myself, except when I plan ahead.

My Husband, Abe randomly made some jambalaya several years ago with some gator meat he stumbled upon, though it turned out more like a paella. False advertisement aside, it was delicious, but it got me wondering about the differences in the two dishes.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN JAMBALAYA AND PAELLA?

When you compare these two dishes, you're definitely going to notice some similarities in ingredients. Rice, garlic, some seafood,

sometimes chicken in both. But the flavor profiles are very distinct.

Paella, hailing from Spain, tends to have a more subtle flavor that is dominated by saffron. Jambalaya is much more robust and spicy. thanks to the Cajun-style seasonings and use of sausage.

While jambalaya is enjoyed all year long in the United States, it's particularly popular during Mardi Gras. In New Orleans, you'd be hard pressed not to find a version in several restaurants, served alongside heaping plates of fluffy beignets.



The Recipe: Slow Cooker Jambalaya

Preparation: Prep Time: 30 minutes • Cooking Time: 4 hours • Servings: 6

Andouille sausage, chicken, and shrimp marry with Cajun-spiced rice and vegetables in this easy weekday or weekend meal.

INGREDIENTS

- 12 ounces fully cooked andouille sausage 1 package
- 1/4 cup dry white wine
- 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts cut into 1-inch
- 3 bell peppers green, red, and yellow, diced
- 3 ribs celery chopped
- 1 red onion diced
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- 2 cups unsalted chicken broth
- 28 ounces (can) crushed tomatoes
- 3-4 tablespoons Creole seasoning
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme or 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 bay leaves
- Kosher salt to taste
- Cracked black pepper to taste
- 1 1/2 cups white rice uncooked
- 1/2 pound uncooked shrimp peeled and deveined
- Cilantro for garnish (optional)
- Scallions for garnish (optional)



INSTRUCTIONS

- Grease a 5- or 6-quart slow cooker pot with non-stick cooking spray.
- Slice sausage into 1/4-inch discs. In a skillet set over medium-high heat, cook sausage for 5-7 minutes, stirring occasionally, until it begins to brown. Deglaze the pan with the wine, scraping the browned bits with a spatula. Place in prepared slow cooker.
- Add cubed chicken, bell peppers, celery, onion, garlic, chicken broth, tomatoes, Creole seasoning, pepper flakes, thyme, bay leaves, salt, and pepper, stirring to combine.
- Cover and cook for 3.5 hours on high. Stir in rice and cook another 30 minutes until rice is fully cooked and tender. Add shrimp and cook 15 minutes more, or until shrimp are pink and cooked through.
- Gently fluff jambalaya with a fork before serving. Garnish with chopped cilantro and/or scallions if desired, and serve with pepper sauce on the side (if you like it extra hot!)

My Go-To Picks at Flagler Tavern

I'm a creature of habit. When I find something I love, I stick with it - especially when it comes to food. My husband, Scotty, and I enjoy dining out, even though we cook a lot at home with the kids. We always make time for at least one meal out together, no matter how busy life gets. I love discovering new spots, but I also appreciate having a go-to place where I know the food will be consistently fantastic.

Lately, my go-to for a casual lunch that never disappoints is Flagler Tavern in New Smyrna Beach. Whenever we head there, I already know what I'm ordering. First up, a Coastal Mule (below). This drink is made

with ten-times distilled Deep Eddy Vodka, fresh lime juice, and ginger beer, garnished with a sprig of mint, a lime wedge, and candied ginger. The presentation is spot on, served in a chilled copper mug with the fresh mint and that

game-changing candied ginger Honestly, candied ginger should be a requirement for all mules - it's that good!

Next, I always get the corn rib appetizer (below). It's a specialty, so they can sell out quickly, and I almost regret telling you about it because I want to make sure there's enough left for Susan Sigler and me next Sunday!



A corn rib might sound odd, but trust me, it's the appetizer you never knew you needed. They take corn on the cob, slice it into four "ribs," toss them in Mexicaninspired spices, and grill them to perfection. They're topped with fresh herbs and served with a creamy ranch-like dipping sauce. The best part? They're easy to eat and won't get stuck in your teeth, making them perfect for sharing. I highly recommend them!

For my lunch order, I always go for the Greek Salad with Blackened Chicken (featured left). It's a delicious mix of grape tomatoes, shaved onions, chopped cucumber, Kalamata olives, feta cheese, and pepperoncini, all served on a bed of romaine lettuce tossed with lemon vinaigrette dressing and topped with perfectly seasoned blackened chicken. The flavors are always on point and never disappoint.

If I'm there for dinner, I switch things up and order the Teriyaki Bowl. You can choose between chicken, shrimp, or a mix of zucchini and yellow squash, all served over a bed of lemon ginger jasmine rice. The dish is loaded with sautéed mushrooms, caramelized onions, steamed carrots, and sautéed peppers, all finished with a flavorful teriyaki glaze. I usually go for the chicken - it's absolutely wonderful. For those looking to keep it gluten-free, just skip the teriyaki glaze. And if you're vegetarian, opt for the zucchini and squash; it's equally delicious!

No matter where we sit inside the tavern, I can always get my favorite

dishes. Sometimes we like to sit outside and watch the street, while on Sundays, you'll usually find us in the main dining room. For our "day dates," we tend to hang out at the Indigo Bar, tucked away at the bottom of the stairs. And if we're going for dinner, we head upstairs to The Bounty. It has this swanky vibe that's perfect for a date or meeting up with friends. If you haven't checked it out yet, the ambiance is unbeatable!



Ponce Inlet SEPT Tide Chart



August Fishing Report: Hot Weather and a Hot Bite!

August brought the heat - and the fish were biting just as hot! The backwaters of New Smyrna Beach and the Indian River Lagoon are teeming with bait, drawing in an array of trophy species eager to show their teeth.



Redfish have been actively patrolling the creeks, while snook are sunning themselves along the banks, eagerly popping bait. Trout, often elusive, have been lurking in the deeper holes, providing anglers with a thrilling challenge.

I had the pleasure of hosting my friends, Zed and Tommy Layson, who were in town from Barbados for a surf contest. We couldn't resist the calm, beautiful evening behind my house, so we decided to hit the water.

Using chunk mullet, the boys managed to land two impressive gator trout. Tommy opted for a circle hook, while his dad, Zed, went with a jig head. Both techniques led to an epic battle and a successful catch!

As we transition into the fall season, expect the bite to stay strong. The bait will continue to thicken, and with any luck, the water clarity will improve as well.

Best Days to Fish in September: 1-5, 10-12, 17-19, 23-24, 29-30

September Fishing Tips:


- Target Early Morning Hours: As the temperatures start to cool down in September, the early morning hours can be particularly productive. Fish are often more active at dawn, making it the perfect time to cast your line.
- Use Live Bait for Snook: With snook still
 hanging around the banks, using live bait
 like pilchards or shrimp can increase your
 chances of a bite. Focus on areas with
 good water flow for the best results.
- Vary Your Retrieval Speed: When targeting redfish, try varying your retrieval speed. Sometimes a slower, more deliberate approach can entice a bite from these patrolling predators.
- Look for Baitfish Schools: As baitfish congregate in September, keep an eye out for birds diving or surface disturbances. These are good indicators

- of where game fish like trout and redfish may be feeding.
- 5. Adjust for Tides: Pay close attention to the tides, as they play a crucial role in where fish will be. Incoming tides often bring in fresh bait and hungry fish, so timing your outings with the tide can improve your success.
