## Changes to Votran: What Happens When the Bus Stops Coming

Volusia County is preparing to eliminate several long-standing Votran bus routes and shift riders to VoRide, a tech-based, on-demand microtransit system powered by Uber Transit. The change, planned for early 2026, is raising concerns among riders who depend most on traditional public transportation.

Under the proposal, multiple east and west side routes would be replaced by VoRide, which requires riders to book trips through a smartphone app or by calling a dispatch line. Riders and advocates worry the new model may not be accessible for those without reliable devices, technology skills or stable phone access — including seniors, low-income residents, people with disabilities and individuals experiencing homelessness.

Federal law requires public outreach and equity analysis before major service changes. VoRide currently serves parts of West Volusia, including DeLand, Deltona, DeBary and Orange City.

At recent community meetings, many attendees described relying on fixed routes for essential trips to medical appointments, jobs, classes and family obligations. Votran representatives said low ridership on several routes — sometimes with only a few or no riders — drove the decision. They said shifting to on-demand service would reduce costs and reallocate resources to higher-demand areas.

John Davidson, a New Smyrna Beach resident and longtime rider who uses a power wheelchair, said he has depended on Votran for 27 years to travel to work. He has not yet switched to VoRide but is already experiencing changes in how he books rides. "I used to have a standing order for my pickup and drop-off, but now I have to call each time," he said. Davidson said early problems with long phone hold times improved after AT&T addressed phone line issues.

The County Council approved the service changes Oct. 7, 2025. According to the Nov. 18 meeting agenda, council members also approved an amendment allowing the transit and maintenance contractor to begin microtransit services in designated areas. Meeting minutes had not been posted at the time of publication.

Davidson, who spoke at the Nov. 18 meeting to raise concerns about phone access, said he is now communicating directly with Transit Services Director Bobbie King. "Speaking with her makes me feel increasingly reassured," he said. "I get a live person who walks me through the booking when I call for my ride." He added that the transition will "take some getting used to," but he is hopeful.

While fares are considered low, some riders said cost could still pose challenges for those on fixed incomes. VoRide fares start at \$2 for trips up to 5 miles and increase by \$1 per additional mile, up to a \$7 maximum. Fares for youth, seniors

and people with disabilities are half-price. Children under 7 ride free with a paying adult.

Concerns raised during public meetings included technology barriers, loss of guaranteed routes and stops, the lack of Sunday or holiday service, and uncertainty during the transition. Supporters say the model could offer more flexible and

affordable travel, but its success will depend on riders' comfort with booking tools, access to a phone and ability to walk short distances to pickup points.

Winter Weather in Florida: The Hidden Risk of Freezing Pipes

Florida isn't known for harsh winters, but every year cold fronts sweep through our state and drop temperatures low enough to create real problems for homeowners. One of the most common—and costly—winter-weather losses we see at Trust Public Adjusting Group is damage caused by freezing pipes.

When water freezes, it expands. Inside a pipe, that expansion creates extreme pressure, often enough to crack or burst the line. The real trouble begins when temperatures rise and the ice melts. Water begins pouring through the break, sometimes for hours before anyone notices.

The results can be devastating: water-damaged drywall, ruined flooring and mold growth to name a few.

Because Florida homes aren't built for freezing conditions, they're often more vulnerable than homes in colder states. Pipes are commonly located in uninsulated attics, exterior walls, and outdoor areas—making them more susceptible to cold snaps.

To prevent frozen pipes, let your faucets drip when temperatures approach freezing. Flowing water relieves pressure and reduces the risk of costly damage.

Even a brief cold snap can freeze pipes, and damage may appear quickly once temperatures rise. After freezing weather, check that faucets flow properly, look under sinks for moisture, listen for unusual sounds in walls or ceilings, and inspect the exterior for leaks or pooling water. If you suspect a burst or cracked pipe, you can contact Trust Public Adjusting Group immediately. Early documentation is key to maximizing coverage.

Cold nights may be rare in Florida, but they can cause serious damage when they strike.

Creating Our Florida Holiday Traditions

I grew up in southeastern Ohio where there were very clear seasons and traditions that align with weather-based activities: apple picking, raking fall leaves, sledding down a snowy hill, cutting down a Christmas tree from the farm. While I will admit the temperature and humidity here in Florida has gone down a bit, it still feels like a tamer version of summer nearly year-round. Due to this, I have had to adjust my expectations of what constitutes holiday traditions and feel like my family is finally in a fun rhythm that I'd love to share!

For the past several years, my girls and I have headed over to De Leon Springs to pick our own veggies for Thanksgiving dinner at VoLaSalle Farms (601 Johnson Lake Rd). The green beans are ready each year, but it has turned into an interesting conversation with my kids about what to do when the squash isn't ready and how we need to find something else to complement our meal. This is not a grocery store where any item is found all year, we can only harvest and eat what is ready!

On our most recent trip, we did pull up carrots along with our usual green beans, Italian sweet peppers, and wildflowers. The Crump family that runs the farm let my girls feed the carrot greens to the goats, also housed on the farm.



In the past, they have hooked up barrels to the tractor to give kids a "train ride" past the cows and orange groves. We end our time bagging up some of their oranges to take home and purchasing orange juice and their famous pumpkin rolls.

Moving into the Christmas season, we love visiting the holiday light displays in both Daytona and Holly Hill. We were able to attend the opening night of the "Magic of Lights" at the Daytona International Speedway (1801 ISB Blvd) on Friday, November 21st. This event allows you to drive under the stands at the speedway with holiday music playing through the car's radio to see holiday stories brought to life through moving lights and cruise through light tunnels with the windows down, and is open until January 3.

In recent years, Magic of Lights has added a "Holiday Village" near the end of the loop to get out of your car for photo ops, snacks, merchandise, and games to play.

In Holly Hill, the Twi-Light II Motel at 1125 Ridgewood Avenue is normally small and unassuming, but after Thanksgiving, the



motel cottages and home of the owners behind it is decked out in light displays, inflatable characters, and visits from Santa himself. While you can drive through this event, my family chooses to take our time to walk around the grounds. There are lots of great photo spots and usually a friendly face handing out candy canes to passersby.

I think my favorite part of these few traditions is that they are not dependent on the weather. Sure, it's fun to walk through light displays when it's cooler so I can hold a cup of hot cocoa, but we don't have to wait for snow to enjoy all three of these activities as they

can be experienced at any Florida temperature.



I love that my family is making and keeping new traditions to enjoy in the place where we live and I hope that you enjoy your Florida holidays, as well!

Lights On at Brevard Zoo: A Nighttime Art & Wildlife Experience

If you're looking for something memorable to enjoy this season—whether you're hosting family, planning a date night, or simply wanting to experience the wild in a new way—the Brevard Zoo's all-new Lights On: A Nighttime Art Exhibit offers a beautifully unique adventure. This after-dark experience blends art, conservation, and nocturnal animal encounters into one glowing, immersive evening.

Asian lantern festivals at zoos have been popping up everywhere lately, but Brevard Zoo said, "Let's do something that no one else is doing." Instead of simply walking past light displays shaped like pandas and poinsettias, you're invited to experience the zoo itself at night—while the nocturnal animals are awake, alert— giving guests an after-hours peek into a world we'd otherwise never see.

Upon arrival, you're handed a small but absolutely necessary tool: an infrared flashlight. Since most nocturnal animals don't perceive red light the way humans do, it allows you to see the zoo's nighttime residents clearly without disturbing them. It also comes in handy because portions of the zoo remain dim to protect the animals' natural rhythms.

That flashlight earned its keep immediately. As soon as we got out of the car all the way in the parking lot, we heard the lions roaring from across the park—a deep, echoing sound that vibrates right through you. Naturally, we followed the sound like moths to a flame and found them in the Africa loop, casually lounging in a cozy little cuddle pile. The big male monitored us with the kind of judgment only cats are capable of.

Throughout the night, we encountered some animals far more active than during a typical daytime visit. The alligators along the Wild Florida trail glided silently through their dark lagoon. The snakes in the venom house were twisting and weaving through each other and branches overhead. On the Rainforest loop, Avery shared a moment with the jaguar, who gave a rumbling roar before strolling up to the glass to inspect her with slow, deliberate curiosity.

Interwoven with these wildlife encounters is a full art exhibition unlike anything we've seen at a zoo. Project Holocene, created by South African artist Russell Ronat, features more than 30 illuminated works highlighting endangered species. Many of the paintings reveal themselves gradually, glowing into view as you approach and fading out again with a timing that reflects each species'

level of endangerment. It's beautiful, emotional, and deeply thoughtful—an experience designed to both captivate and educate.

The Expedition Africa loop comes alive with vibrant, glow-in-the-dark murals by artist German Lemus. These neon creations are bold and intricate, transforming the pathways into luminous art corridors that feel almost otherworldly.

Another element our family loved is the immersive virtual reality experience, created in partnership with Wildlife Protection Solutions. Donning the headset transports you into the natural environments of elephants, manatees, eagles, sea turtles, and more. At one stop, you're standing in an eagle's nest; the next, you're splashing in a watering hole beneath towering elephants. These experiences are playful, eye-opening, and surprisingly moving.

Of course, no nighttime adventure is complete without late night snacks! The refreshment stand offers light snacks, drinks, and festive glow beverages—both alcoholic and non-alcoholic—complete with light-up "ice" cubes that both kids and adults will enjoy. Glow merchandise is also available, adding an extra touch

of holiday whimsy as you wander through illuminated trails

Lights On offers something rare: a chance to explore the zoo at night while engaging with art, wildlife, and conservation in an entirely new way. #### Peanut Butter Cheesecake Stuffed Strawberries

These quick and easy Peanut Butter Cheesecake Stuffed Strawberries will be a hit at any shindig! Fresh strawberries stuffed with a peanut butter cream cheese filling, then dressed up for the party with some crushed peanuts and fun sprinkles.

Total Time: 1 Hour | Servings: 30

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Cut the top (leaves) off of each strawberry. Use a small sharp knife (or melon baller) to carefully hull the center of the berries.
- Place the crushed peanuts in a small bowl and set aside. Place the chocolate in a separate small bowl and melt in the microwave for 30 seconds. Continue melting in 10 second increments if necessary.
- Slice off a bit of the tip of each strawberry so it can stand up; stand to dry on a paper towel. Dip the bottom of each strawberry into chocolate, then roll in the crushed peanuts. Place on a parchment lined pan and refrigerate while you make the filling.
- 4. Place the cream cheese in a large bowl and beat until smooth, about 2 minutes. Add peanut butter, vanilla, and powdered sugar and beat until combined and smooth, adding more powdered sugar and/or peanut butter to taste.
- 5. Spoon the mixture into a piping bag fitted with a 2D Wilton star tip (a zipper bag with a corner cut off will work in a pinch!) Fill each strawberry with the peanut butter cheesecake mixture, then sprinkle with festive sprinkles or more crushed peanuts. Place finished strawberries on a serving tray and refrigerate until ready to serve.



Note: Prepared stuffed berries can be made and refrigerated up to 4 hours in advance.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 30 medium to large fresh strawberries washed & dried
- 8 ounces dark chocolate chopped
- peanuts crushed; for garnish
- 1 package 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup peanut butter creamy
- ¼ cup powdered sugar
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- Decorative sprinkles for garnish



For anglers who want to level up their time on the water, a fish finder/chartplotter combo is hard to beat. From essential entry-level units to high-end tech, there's a model for every budget — and standout options like Garmin's ECHOMAP UHD2 bring clarity, mapping, and serious value to any fishing trip.

# The Boat Coach

#### **Last-Minute Gifts for Boaters**

Finding the right gift for a boater can be anything from budget-friendly to seriously high-end — but there's no shortage of useful gear that'll make anyone's time on the water better.

#### Handheld VHF Radio

A handheld VHF radio is one of the smartest gifts you can give. While many boaters rely on cellphones to contact marinas, friends, or even the U.S. Coast Guard in an emergency, true mariners know phones can break, can't get wet, and only reach 5 to 10 miles offshore. A VHF radio broadcasts over Channel 16—the Coast Guard's hailing channel—so anyone listening can respond or relay a call for help.

A solid option is the Uniden Atlantis 275 Marine Handheld VHF. It floats, is IPX8 waterproof, has 6 watts of power, and receives all U.S./international/Canadian marine channels plus NOAA weather alerts. It lists at \$149.99 and was available on Amazon for \$115.12 at the time of writing. Similar radios range from about \$39.99 to more than \$350.

#### **Dry Bags**

Waterproof storage bags — better known as dry bags — are always appreciated for their versatility. They protect clothing, provisions, phones, first-aid items, and other water-sensitive gear. West Marine carries them in multiple sizes and styles. At press time, options ranged from small waterproof hip bags to 10-liter dry bags priced between \$20.99 and \$99.99. A three-bag set (3L, 5L, 8L) was available in stores for \$64.99.

#### Fish Finder/Chartplotter Combos

A fish finder/chartplotter is a great gift for boaters who love to fish. Bass Pro Shops offers units starting at \$179.98 and reaching \$3,000 depending on capability. A standout mid-range choice is the Garmin ECHOMAP UHD2 53cv with GT20-TM transducer and Navionics+ U.S. Inland Mapping for \$399.99 — a savings of \$50.01.

#### **Boarding Mats**

For boaters who like to keep things clean, boarding mats help keep dirt off the deck. Basic versions can run under \$30 on Amazon. For something more personal, The Custom Captain offers mats customized with the boat's name: \$60 for an 18-by-24-inch mat, \$85 for 24-by-36, and \$149 for 36-by-60.

#### Monogrammed Towels

For the yachtsman, a monogrammed towel set is both useful and upscale. The Cape Marin sells a six-piece luxury embroidered set for \$139.99, with turnaround in as little as five days.

#### **Boat Hooks and Multi-Tools**

No boat is complete without a reliable boat hook for docking and fending off. Prices range from under \$20 to more than \$70 on Amazon. For a premium pick, Revolve offers a 3-in-1 boating tool that combines a boat hook, stiff deck brush, and soft cleaning brush in a compact rollable kit. Regularly \$174.95, it was offered at \$119.99 at press time.

#### Offshore Beanbag Chairs (pictured below)

For offshore anglers, nothing beats a marine beanbag chair for stability and comfort in rough seas. Ocean-Tamer carries three sizes — small (\$109.95), medium (\$119.95), and large (\$129.95)—all double-stitched with two handles for those "oh-sh\*t" moments.



#### **Crew Shirts**

Crew shirts make a great year-round gift and are perfect for holiday gatherings on board. East Coast Customs has served Volusia County for two decades and holds a 4.9 Google rating with nearly 500 reviews. Prices vary based on shirt quality, design, and quantity, and quotes can be requested online at eastcoastcustoms3.godaddysites.com.

# Backwater Fishing Report

Best Days to Fish:

December: 4-6, 10-11, 16-22, 26-28

Winter is closing in with a handful of cold days mixed with mostly warm ones, and the fishing has been top-notch.

As the colder weather creeps in, expect much clearer water, tighter schools of fish, and bigger bait pods pushing through the backwaters.

This is my favorite time of year, as visibility is at its best and artificial bait fishing really kicks up a notch.

Recently, my fishing buddies Rusty Roberts, Dave McKinnon and Roddy Rupp all scored some epic catches.

Roddy landed a solid black drum on live shrimp. Dave hooked a few nice redfish using Henn Lures' Shrinnow, and Rusty sight-casted a beautiful redfish with the Henn Shrimp. As for me, I've been on a snook rampage with both the Henn Shrimp and the Shrinnow.

As the water cools, look for groups of trout, redfish and snook stacking up. Keep things quiet and stay as stealthy as possible, and with a little luck, you'll hook into some solid fish.


