Hands-on Experience

Animationland Explores Art, Science, and Storytelling

Transporting visitors of all ages to a fantastical land with a quirky cast of characters, Animationland is an exhibition where inspiration is everywhere. Developed by the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry, it's the newest special exhibition at the Orange County Regional History Center in downtown Orlando.

Visitors to the museum step into a colorful, whimsical environment where Tracey the pencil dog and friends lead them through activities in sketching, sound, storyboard-ing, and stop-motion filmmaking. The exhibition highlights the playful partnership of imagination, drawing, science and storytelling at the heart of animation.

In addition to nationally touring components of the exhibition, the History Center's exhibition staff have curated a special section celebrating a remarkable chapter in Central Florida's animation history. Titled "Drawing Magic: Walt Disney Feature Animation Florida," this portion of Animationland will explore how the Orlando-based studio contributed to iconic films such as Beauty and the Beast, The Lion King, Mulan, and Lilo & Stitch, and how its artists helped shape Disney's animation renaissance.

Through studio artifacts, photographs, and artwork, visitors will get to know this special creative community, which began with Disney in 1989 and continues to flourish today more than two decades after the studio's closing.

"So many of us grew up with animated films that shaped how we imagine, dream, and tell stories," said Katie Kelley, curator of exhibitions for the History Center. "Animationland gives visitors the chance to explore that creative spark for themselves—and also to discover how a part of that story was made right here in Central Florida. It's a wonderful reminder of how creativity connects us."

While the exhibition is on view through May 3, the History Center will offer related programming. On February 15, the museum's Sensory Sunday program will celebrate Black animators and storytellers. Sensory Sundays are scheduled quarterly and provide a welcoming experience for guests with autism spectrum disorder and sensory processing sensitivity.

Then on March 8, the History Center will present a panel of animators who worked at Walt Disney Feature Animation Florida, the groundbreaking studio that operated at Disney-MGM Studios from 1989 to 2004. Other events will be listed on the mu-seum's website.

Admission to the Orange County Regional History Center is \$10 for adults and \$6 for children. On March 8, visitors can enjoy free admission to the museum on Free Access Day. For more information, visit TheHistoryCenter.org.

If you're looking for a laid-back beach vibe, Toni & Joe's Patio is hard to beat. Early mornings, mimosas, spiked coffee and sunrise views over the beach—it's a whole vibe. I like the blueberry pancakes and Scotty usually gets the avocado toast.

LUNCH DATES

Prima on Sams Avenue in New Smyrna Beach is our go-to lunch date. Garlic knots, a salad and maybe a slice of pie if we're feeling wild.

Breakers is another favorite—great burgers, but I always go for the loaded chili or the blackened mahi sandwich. And we're guaranteed to run into friends, which makes it even better.

My ideal day date is hitting the Goodwill in Port Orange and then heading across the street to Filo Greek. Falafel, pita on the side and all the toppings. I could eat there every day. It's fast food done healthy.

DINNER DATES

For dinner, The Spott on Canal Street is one of our favorites. We split a lot of our meals and love sharing the filet with potato pavé and spicy green beans. Pair that with the new Brussels Sprout Caesar and you have what dreams are made of. After dinner you can head upstairs to their speakeasy for a crème brûlée and espresso martini. You're welcome.

We also love The Grille at Riverview on Flagler Avenue. It's right on the river, and the views alone make it worth the visit. We almost always head straight for the outdoor patio, even on cooler nights. They keep the heaters going, so you still get that waterfront experience without freezing. One of the best-kept secrets is their sunset menu, offered Monday through Friday from 4 to 6 p.m. It's a great way to enjoy a laid-back, romantic meal on the river without breaking the bank.

Real Estate Update

A Look at the 2026 Housing Market in Volusia County

Nationally, housing economists are pointing to 2026 as a year of recovery. According to National Association of REALTORS (NAR) Chief Economist Lawrence Yun, easing mortgage rates, improving affordability, and growing inventory are expected to bring more buyers back into the market. Florida is already showing early signs of that shift, with buyer activity rebounding late in 2025 and seasonal patterns beginning to normalize. Locally in Volusia County, those broader trends are taking shape, creating a more balanced and predictable market as we head into the year ahead.

Florida Realtors' Chief Economist, Brad O'Connor, reports a late year rebound in buyer activity into early 2026. "Mortgage rates fell by more than half a percentage point in the waning months of the year, and as a result, sales really responded here in the Sunshine State." This has led to a multi-month streak of positive growth for closed sales of single family homes across the state.

Local market data from the New Smyrna Beach Board of REALTORS® shows that single-family home sales in Volusia County edged up at the end of 2025. Prices remain on the higher end, but are cooling from recent peaks reflecting a healthier, more balanced market rather than a downturn. Homes are taking longer to sell, giving buyers more time while still rewarding well-priced listings. For 2026 sellers, thoughtful pricing and preparation matter more than timing alone.

Tippi Schalkham, a local mortgage professional with The Mortgage Firm, notes that buyer behavior in the market has more intention. "The mindset is shifting from wait and see to plan and adapt. As we head into 2026, it's becoming clear that today's pricing environment isn't a short-term phase. Buy-

ers who succeed are those adjusting expectations and focusing on what a realistic monthly payment looks like for their budget."

"The best time to buy comes down to personal readiness and long-term affordability," stated Schalkham, "not from trying to predict where rates or the market will go next." While rates remain higher than historic lows, buyers are focusing on affordability tools such as rate buydowns, seller credits, and loan product options.

For sellers, the market is placing greater emphasis on pricing and flexibility. Buyers are paying closer attention to affordability, making seller concessions and realistic pricing more important than in recent years. Properties that align with current buyer expectations are moving, while others may require additional strategy to gain traction.

Condo and townhome inventory followed a different pattern in 2025, with a slower market through much of the year in Volusia County before showing signs of recovery toward year's end. Median sale prices dipped modestly year-over-year and inventory remains higher than single-family homes. Buyers are active and have



negotiating leverage but are more selective with increased association costs and financing requirements continuing to influence decisions.

"Condo and townhome buyers, in particular, need to know that early lender involvement is essential," comments Schalkham. "Financing these properties now requires additional review of association insurance, financials, and reserves. The process can be more complex and time-consuming than financing a single-family home."

For 2026, the real estate market is shaping up to be a year of more informed decision making. With conditions varying by property type, price point, and neighborhood, local insight matters more than ever. Buyers and sellers who take the time to understand their options and choose to work with experienced local real estate and lending professionals should be best positioned to navigate the market with clarity and confidence in the year ahead.

Florida Freezes: Protecting Your Property from Burst Pipes This Winter

When temperatures unexpectedly dip in Florida, most property owners aren't thinking about frozen pipes. They're thinking, "It won't get that cold here." Unfortunately, it doesn't take long for freezing weather to cause serious water damage.

When water inside plumbing lines freezes, it expands. That expansion creates intense pressure inside the pipe. If the pressure becomes too great, the pipe cracks or bursts. Stronger in the Broken Places: A Story of Survival by James E. Gahan

Sitting across from James Gahan, it's hard to reconcile the man in front of you with what he survived. There's nothing performative about him. No theatrics. Just a calm presence that feels earned. And when he starts talking, you realize pretty quickly this isn't a story you listen to casually.

James fell two stories from the walkway of an American Airlines airplane. A sudden, violent moment that changed everything. The injuries were severe enough to require numerous surgeries, and there were long stretches where he didn't know where he was or who he was. Hospitals hesitated. Some turned him away. His body was pushed to the edge again and again, and more than once he came dangerously close to not surviving an operating table.

What struck me most wasn't just the physical trauma—it was how much of himself he lost along the way. Identity, memory, certainty. All of it was stripped away while doctors worked to keep him alive. And yet, somehow, he's here. Talking. Reflecting. Moving forward.

During one of his surgeries, James described an experience that clearly stayed with him. He believes he left his body. He recalls seeing his father, who had passed, and what he understood to be God. Whether spiritual, psychological, or something shaped by trauma, it changed how he saw his life. He didn't present it as fact or proof—just as something deeply personal that brought peace at a time when everything else was chaos. That peace is what lingers when you talk to him.

His recovery wasn't clean or quick. It was uneven, painful, and uncertain. But somewhere in that process, James chose to keep going, with his devoted service dog, Jack, by his side—not just physically, but emotionally and spiritually. That choice eventually became "Stronger in the Broken Places," a book that reads less like a victory lap and more like an honest record of survival.

What's incredible isn't just that James lived through the fall, the surgeries, or the setbacks. It's that he found a way to move forward without bitterness. Without needing to convince anyone of anything. He shares his story simply because it exists—and because sometimes hearing that survival is possible is enough.




Florida or Bust

Where History Meets the River: Exploring Suwannee County

There's something about North Florida that invites you to slow down—really slow down—and our family's recent trip to Live Oak and Suwannee County delivered exactly that kind of reset. ECC readers may remember Suwannee Music Park from past adventures; it's a place we return to year after year for winter festivals and holiday lights, and one of our favorite camping spots anywhere in the state. Tucked along the Suwannee River, sprawling across 800 wooded acres, it somehow manages to feel both secluded and convenient, with town just a short drive away.

In recent years, though, our visits have been plagued by what we jokingly call the "Curse of the Camper..." rain, rain, and more rain. Those soggy trips kept us close to camp and sent us indoors. This time? Clear blue skies and perfectly mild 70-degree days.

We brought along Avery's beloved sidekick, Bam-Bam—the youngest of our three dogs and a rescued terrier mix—while his older siblings enjoyed a spoiled staycation with the grandparents.

One afternoon was spent hiking Suwannee River State Park, where nature and history are deeply intertwined. Trails wind past remnants of 19th-century steamship travel, Civil War earthworks built to defend the railroad crossing at the former town of Columbus, and two ghost towns slowly reclaimed by sandhill wilderness. The most haunting discoveries were the small cemeteries tucked into the woods, with headstones dating back as early as 1862.

The following day took us to nearby White Springs and a long-awaited stop on our family's Florida Bucket List at Big Shoals State Park, home to Florida's only Class III whitewater rapids. Hiking out to the overlook, we were nearly alone, accompanied only by the crunch of our footsteps, Avery's chatter, and the distant roar of rushing water. It felt like we'd stumbled into our own private corner of the state.

What we found on this trip wasn't a packed itinerary—it was an easy rhythm. Campfire meals, hammock reading, bark-and-leaf boats drifting downriver, and long stretches of doing absolutely nothing together. And honestly? That was the best part.

What's next for our Live Oak visits? Nearby Olustee Battlefield and checking a few more springs off that bucket list. Until then, you can find more ideas for exploring Suwannee County and North Florida at VisitSuwannee.com and VisitFlorida.com.

Exploring D Ranch Preserve: West Volusia's Newest Nature Escape

Central Florida has welcomed a new haven for outdoor enthusiasts with the opening of D Ranch Preserve, a protected natural area tucked away in Osteen. Once a working cattle ranch, the preserve now spans more than 400 acres of permanently conserved land, offering visitors an authentic glimpse of Florida's native landscape. Free to visit and open daily from sunrise to sunset, D Ranch Preserve is an easy escape for anyone looking to step away from pavement and into nature.

At the heart of the preserve is a thoughtfully designed network of trails that wind through pine flatwoods, wetlands, oak hammocks, and open pasture. The trails are mostly flat, well marked, and ideal for casual exploration, making them accessible for walkers, birdwatchers, and families. Because the land serves as a protected wildlife corridor, encounters with native species are common. Gopher tortoises often appear along sandy trail edges, while sandhill cranes forage in the grasslands. Overhead, visitors may spot bald eagles, hawks, and scrub jays, and along the tree lines, white-tailed deer and wild turkeys are frequent sights. The wide-open landscape and low crowds give the preserve a calm, unhurried atmosphere.

Adding a creative touch to the experience is the preserve's newest Wings of the West mural, located about ten minutes along the red hiking trail. Created by artist Erica Group, the bat-inspired wings highlight one of the preserve's lesser-known residents and pair naturally with the bat boxes found farther down the trail. The mural offers a photo opportunity that feels like a hidden discovery rather than a distraction.

Community involvement is a key part of life at D Ranch Preserve. On the first Tuesday of each month, volunteers gather for the First Tuesday Trail Team to help maintain the trails, often ending the morning with a casual picnic. The preserve also hosts seasonal Star Parties for stargazing and guided Explore D Ranch nature walks led by knowledgeable staff and guest experts.

Looking ahead, plans are underway for a future \$2.5 million nature center, which will serve as an educational hub focused on local ecosystems and conservation. Once completed, it will further establish D Ranch Preserve as a cornerstone of environmental stewardship in West Volusia.

A visit pairs easily with nearby experiences, including a stop at the beloved Osteen Diner or a bike ride along regional routes connecting to Titusville and the Lake Monroe Loop. Whether visiting for a quiet walk or a community event, D Ranch Preserve offers a welcoming and grounded connection to the natural side of West Volusia.

Strawberry Cheesecake Pancakes

Why not have breakfast and dessert on one plate with a batch of these Strawberry Cheesecake Pancakes! Fluffy cream cheese-stuffed pancakes, whipped cream, and homemade strawberry sauce - they totally blow any restaurant version out of the water with their decadence!

Total Time: 40 Minutes | Servings: 15 pancakes

INSTRUCTIONS

Strawberry Topping:

1. Place the strawberries, sugar, and lemon juice in a saucepan set over medium-low heat. Bring to a low boil and cook 12-15 minutes, or until strawberries cook down and thicken.
2. For a smoother sauce, mash the berries with the back of a spoon. Set aside and keep warm.

Cheesecake Pancakes

1. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt.
2. In a separate bowl, use an electric mixer to beat 4 ounces of cream cheese and sugar together until smooth. Add the eggs one at a time until combined, then beat in the buttermilk, melted butter, lemon juice, and vanilla until smooth.
3. Gently fold the wet ingredients into the flour mixture until just combined. Add the remaining cubed cream cheese and fold in gently. Allow the batter to rest for 10 minutes.
4. Heat a pancake pan (or large frying pan or electric griddle) over medium heat. Lightly grease with oil or non-stick cooking spray.
5. Pour 1/4 cup of batter per pancake onto the griddle and cook for 2-3 minutes until tops are slightly dry looking, with small air bubbles beginning to form. Flip, and continue cooking on the other side, 1-2 minutes, until golden brown. Keep pancakes warm in a low temperature oven while you work through the batter.
6. Stack pancakes with layers of whipped cream & strawberry sauce and serve.



INGREDIENTS

STRAWBERRY TOPPING:

- 2 cups fresh strawberries, cut in half
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice

CHEESECAKE PANCAKES:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour, sifted
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 6 ounces cream cheese softened, divided

- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs room temperature
- 1 cup buttermilk room temperature
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted and cooled
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Whipped cream



Blow Boaters Vs Stinkpots

Over the years there have been contentious exchanges between sailors and power boaters. Sailors often think they possess superior skills compared to those that operate power boats. Which is somewhat true, a sailor must know how to use the wind to get from point A to point B. Power boaters just point. However, all boating, whether power or sail, requires unique knowledge and skills to operate safely, considerately and competently.

Sailboats use wind as their primary form of propulsion, offering relatively quiet, long-range, fuel-free voyages. However, sailors rely on the weather and require more skill and knowledge, handling halyards, sheets and winches for trimming sails, tacking, jibing, etc. Since sailboats cannot sail into the wind, knowledge for navigating to points upwind is essential.

Powerboaters generally use internal combustion engines, mostly diesel or gas, for propulsion and expediency, offering direct routes while consuming fuel. Electric motors have recently gained a foothold on powering boats, however, have not gained popular appeal.

Owning both power and sailboats would be ideal. But the cost of owning, maintaining and storing two boats is impractical. In the end, the choice hinges on priorities: the journey (sail) versus the destination (power), balancing freedom from fuel with the reliability and amenities of engine power, with navigation rules giving sail a right-of-way advantage.

PROS AND CONS OF POWERBOATS

Pros: Speed-powerboats are most often much faster than sailboats. Direct routes, no tacking because of wind direction. Because powerboats often have a greater beam and cabin height, powerboats often offer more space and amenities. Sailboats have deep keels and rudders. Powerboats often have a shallower draft for shallow water/beaches and no mast height issues under bridges. Powerboats are also easier to maneuver in close quarters, like dockside restaurants and marinas.

Cons: High fuel costs (especially large yachts)-marine fuel can run much higher than on the street. Yachts can cost tens of thousands of dollars to fuel. Power boats may be noisy. Then there is engine(s) and equipment maintenance. Additionally, powerboats are limited in range by the capacity of the fuel tank(s).



Sailing and power boating offer very different on-the-water experiences, each with unique advantages and limitations. Sailboats depend on wind conditions and navigation skill, while powerboats provide speed, flexibility and direct travel routes at the cost of fuel consumption. Both demand proper training, situational awareness and adherence to navigation rules. Safe boating begins with understanding your vessel and its capabilities.

Best for: Day trips and accessing shallow areas on smaller open boats. Convenience, amenities and speed to destinations on larger powerboats and luxurious cruising and overnighting on cabin boats and yachts.



PROS AND CONS OF SAILBOATS

Pros: Lower fuel cost. Most larger sailboats have auxiliary engines for maneuvering in marinas and when the wind lets them down. With unlimited range with wind, many sailors have circumnavigated the globe. The experience of sailing is often peaceful, quiet, and eco-friendly. The initial cost and maintenance can be cheaper to operate long-term. Sailboats are great for offshore cruising.

Cons: Dependent on wind. Often much slower (avg. 6-7 knots), a trip to the Gulf Stream from Ponce Inlet can take as little as one-hour with a powerboat. It would take 4-5 hours for a typical sailboat. Sailboats have complex rigging/maintenance (sails, rigging). Most often sailboats offer less living space and deeper draft to operate in. Sailboats often don't respond to the helm quickly at reduced speeds making them harder to maneuver in close quarters. A major con is that a sailboat cannot outrun storms. A day's sail can turn into quite an adventure if the weather suddenly changes.

Best for: The experience and sensation of sailing. Economical long-distance cruising, environmental focus, adventure. Gaining knowledge of weather and environment.

If you are choosing between power and sail, consider your boating goals, budget and destinations. Try out any boats you are considering before you purchase by attending a demo-day at a manufacturer or dealership. Do a sea trial before closing.

Bringing in the new year has brought in a very hot bite — and the fish are definitely cooperating. Redfish, trout, and snook are stacked up in schools around large pods of mullet, finger mullet, and shrimp.

Water clarity right now is outstanding, making for excellent sight fishing. My good friend Dave McKinnon and I have been on a tear lately, throwing one-eighth-ounce jig heads with white paddle tails and consistently catching trout, redfish, and snook.

As water temperatures continue to cool, the mullet pods are getting bigger and more concentrated. With late January bringing record-low cold snaps, fish schools should only become more abundant. Looking ahead to February, expect the bite to heat up even more, especially with the continued clear water helping sight fishermen.

If you're fishing live mullet, I recommend hooking a circle hook through the anal fin or using chunk mullet — both work well depending on your target. I prefer hooking through the anal fin for larger trout and snook, while big redfish tend to favor chunk mullet.

I also finally got to take Michael Mann, product manufacturer for Tupat's Authentic Sauces, out on the water. We enjoyed a great day and caught an abundance of fish.
